A 6-WEEK LEADERSHIP AND ENTREPRENEURIAL CAPACITY DEVELOP-MENT PROGRAMME FOR ADOLESCENT GIRLS IN SENIOR HIGH SCHOOLS WITH THE CORE AIM TO INSPIRE, EQUIP, NURTURE, AND EMPOWER THEM.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The flagship programme of the Intelligent Lady Academy, "*Aspire to Lead*" attracted a diverse cohort of 37 form 3 girls from different educational backgrounds, fostering an enriching learning environment to empower them with principles founded on leadership, entrepreneurship, and community engagement.

The programme was established in response to the pressing need for the acquisition of valuable skills and values needed to thrive as adolescent girls and young women in today's world. Through a holistic approach encompassing classroom learning, hands-on projects, mentorship, and real-world experiences, participants are equipped to embrace leadership roles in business, social enterprises, and beyond.

Facilitators, comprising professionals from diverse fields, played a pivotal role in delivering engaging sessions and fostering a conducive learning

atmosphere. Modules covered critical topics such as self-image, decision-making, and community engagement, fostering personal growth and development among participants.

Participants were awarded certificates to signify the completion of the programme. Feedback from participants and school management highlighted the positive impact of the programme. Testimonials underscored the invaluable lessons learned, emphasizing newfound confidence, improved interpersonal skills, and a heightened sense of purpose.

The success of the Academy sets a precedent for future initiatives aimed at empowering young women. Through collaborative partnerships and a commitment to excellence, "Aspire to Lead" stands poised to shape the next generation of confident, empowered female leaders.

INTRODUCTION

Our goal is to foster positive values, encourage academic excellence, instill leadership skills, and promote the importance of community involvement among the younger generation.

The Academy is a leadership and entrepreneurship capacity development programme for adolescent girls and young women which aims to inspire, equip, nurture, and empower them to be confident leaders and problem solvers in their communities.

The programme is aimed at bridging the gap between academic learning and practical life skills, equipping participants with the tools they need to succeed in various spheres of life. It provides a combination of classroom learning, hands-on projects, mentorship, and real-world experiences to mentorship, and real-world experiences to prepare students for future leadership roles in business, social enterprises, or other fields. Trainings cover topics such as business management, innovation, problem-solving, communication, and teamwork.



BACKGROUND

The founder of "The Intelligent Lady", **Mrs Princess Sekere-Bih** ignited her passion for training young girls in values and essential skills to prepare them for the real-life world while working in Lesotho. She used to gather the girls at Mabathoana High School after school and take them through valuable learning moments. To crown the completion of the programme, students engaged in a community project. They contributed to buy mathematical sets for juveniles preapring to write exams at the Lesotho Correctional Facility. Girls passed out from Mabathoana High with impressive value systems and skillsets to advance into the next phase of their lives.

After a successful programme in Lesotho, Mrs. Sekyere-Bih nurtured the Academy idea and worked assiduously with her team to implement the initiative in Ghana.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

PRE-IMPLEMENTATION

Proposals were distributed to potential schools and Accra Girls High School (AGIIS) embraced the pilot programme with a dedicated list of 37 girls.


Several meetings were held between the school and the Academy team, and within Academy team members to complete logistics including venue, participants, commencement dates, learning or course materials, photography, videography, live streaming, branding items etc. for the programme.

PARTICIPANTS

The maiden edition of the Academy was well attended by 37 Form Three girls carefully selected by the school. The number presented overrode the initial proposed number of 25 girls for the 6 weeks duration. Participants were primarily made up of students from all educational backgrounds including the sciences, business, arts and vocational classes.





IMPACT ASSESSMENT



The Intelligent Lady Academy is a programme used to nurture young people to achieve their aims and objectives in life. Through the six weeks spent at the Intelligent Lady Academy, I have learned about ways and means that one can improve herself, and methods and procedures that one can use to achieve her aims and objectives in life. Among other topics that we have learned so far, the one that is captivating to me is that of responsibility. I learned that responsibilities are the duties that one is supposed to perform and one should be accountable for their responsibility. We learned the "parable of the talents" where a rich man gave his servants three talents. He travelled and when he returned, he expected an account from them. Each of them gave accounts- two of them made profits of what they were given and the last one just returned his talent, untouched. I learnt that to be responsible, you have to learn how to take care of what you are given and develop it. One must develop resources such as skills with greater returns and not just give it back as it was given.
